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Abstract

Economies in many parts of the world are transitioning from a dependence on natural resources to knowledge and technology; fuelling transformations in the ways we work, learn and interact. The Indian economy accommodates all these economic permutations, prompting educators to recognize the Indian individual as learner, worker, and citizen, and the response to these complex interactions on a learner's competitiveness, productivity, engagement, and self-fulfillment. The talk explores the nature of learning, skilling, and knowledge generation in India, and calls for engagement in curricular development and educational administration from Higher Educational Institutions. The zeitgeist calls for a cross pollination of ideas and methods for iteratively relevant learning, and the co-creation of learning pathways for the full spectrum of Indian Learners.
