Dr. Bhagat Oinam is Professor of philosophy, Jawaharlal Nehru University. He is also chairperson of the newly established Centre for the Study of North East India at the university. He had earlier worked at CSDS, NEHU and IIT-Bombay. His areas of interest include existentialism and phenomenology, moral and social philosophy, and indigenous philosophy.
