Jindal Centre for the Global South (JCGS) is announcing a call for submissions of Policy Briefs to be published in JCGS E-publication “Global South Studies Series”

What is JCGS Policy Briefs?

JCGS policy brief is a concise account of the findings and recommendations of a research project on topics relevant to Global South Studies that are related to a broad range of issues and topics affecting Southern countries and peoples. JCGS policy brief may address research questions involving politics, history, economics, culture, social organization, legal systems, agriculture, the environment, global institutions and systems, justice, and more.

The purpose of a JCGS policy brief is to convince the target audience of the urgency of the current problem and the need to adopt the preferred alternative or course of action outlined. It is a call for action for an issue related to Global South.

JCGS Policy briefs are no more than 1500 words (including any table and/or figure), they will be peer-reviewed, and should include:

- Executive Summary (Abstract)-provide an overview of the issue/topic
- Introduction (without heading, as in APA format)-explain the significance of the issue
- Approach (Method) and Results-provide a summary of the facts, describe the issue and context, outline research, describe the current study
- Conclusion-interpretation of data
- Implications and recommendations-discuss what could happen, make recommendations about what should happen, use evidence to support recommendations
- No more than four references
- Footnotes highlighting key points are permitted but not required

JCGS Policy Brief must be formatted using the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (6th ed.) and submitted by email to Jindal Centre for the Global South (jcgs@jgu.edu.in).
