

**REPORT ON JGU VICE CHANCELLOR'S
DELEGATION VISIT TO
SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA**

3-6 December 2019

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1. Introduction

Australia is home to some of the leading universities in the world. O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) has established strong ties with Australian institutions with the aim of creating opportunities for students and faculty to engage more deeply with Australia.

Between 3-4 December 2019, a delegation of JGU faculty members attended a JGU/UNSW interdisciplinary joint conference. Faculty members from JGLS, JGBS, JSGP and JSBF all participated in the conference, jointly hosted by UNSW and JGU. On the sidelines of this conference, a delegation led by Founding Vice Chancellor of JGU, Professor (Dr.) C. Raj Kumar, participated in meetings to boost collaborations with some of Australia's leading institutions.

The delegation, which was in Sydney between 3-6 December 2019, was part of JGU's larger vision to establish strong international collaborations with universities around the world. The Australian visit also dovetailed neatly with JGU's 10-year founding anniversary and celebrations of its 10th year of developing Australia-India linkages.

We are pleased to report that, with this visit, we have established strong engagements with some of the major universities in the Australian state of

In addition, the Vice Chancellor delivered a distinguished public lecture at Government House in Sydney, hosted by the **Her Excellency the Honorable Margaret Beazley AO QC, The Governor of Australia**. The event was attended by Vice Chancellors, judges, leading academics, and senior lawyers.

The partnerships with Western Sydney University and University of New England will enable students to undertake exchange opportunities at JGU and vice versa.

The partnerships with University of Sydney, Macquarie University, University of Technology, Sydney and University of Newcastle encourage faculty members and researchers to undertake exchanges as well as carry out joint research and teaching while also aiming to catalyse collaboration in joint publications, as well as creating international opportunities for students.

The partnership with University of New South Wales Law School will focus on building stronger pathways for PhDs in Australia for faculty members at JGLS.

3. Events and Collaborations

JGU and UNSW hosted a world-class joint conference entitled “***The Judiciary and Public Policy: Australia and India Compared***” between 3-4 December 2019, hosted by the Gilbert & Tobin Centre of

Public Law, which was held at UNSW Law School, Sydney. Faculty members from JGU and UNSW participated in the two-day conference and engaged in intellectual discussions as well as workshopped papers on a broad range of legal and policy-related issues.

4. Collaboration Meetings and University Visits

Macquarie University

Macquarie University (MQ) is one of Sydney's top universities across faculties, with particular strengths in Business and Economics; Arts and Social Sciences; and Media, Journalism, and Communications. It is a global top 250 university (ranked =250, QS 2019). Three JGU faculty have degrees from Macquarie University (Professor Shaun Star, BComm LLB; Professor Charu Sharma, Ph.D.; and Professor Christopher Hale, B.A. (Hons.)). Professor Laknath Jayasinghe is a former faculty member at MQ's Faculty of Business and Economics (2013-16). All these links provide some impetus for strong collaboration.

We have had frequent visits from MQ University staff since 2016 and have been exploring deep collaborations with their Faculty of Business and Economics. We have also hosted several joint conferences and seminars with Macquarie University.

We were delighted to discuss how we could potentially convert direct meetings with Macquarie University staff and faculty into significant tangible outcomes for JGU students and faculty.

Specific aspects of collaboration were discussed with a decision to move forward on the following:

- Dual degree programmes. In addition, prospects for a *Cotutelle* PhD arrangement were also discussed. This will allow the faculty of the two Universities to complete the doctorate under the supervision of experts from both partner Universities.

- The prospects to extend JGU's India Immersion Programme to Macquarie University students were also deliberated and an action plan was established to ensure that students from MQ Business School have opportunities to learn about India on a New Colombo Plan scheme.
- The prospects of a joint JGU / MQ "annual lecture series" were discussed to create a strong intellectual Australian presence in Delhi and at JGU. It was suggested that the inaugural lecture could be presented by the newly appointed Chancellor of Macquarie University, Dr Martin Parkinson, in 2020.
- It was agreed that the JGU and MQ would also explore hosting a Roundtable and Policy Dialogue in Delhi and/or Sydney, focusing on important issues from a cross-disciplinary perspective.
- JSBF will be hosting in 2020 Prof. Abhay Singh, Senior Lecturer, Department of Applied Finance & Director of Macquarie's Finance Decision Law at JGU for a seminar course of one week. This will be the first time when a faculty member from MQ will be coming to JGU to teach a short course.
- JSBF and MQ Department of Applied Finance, led by Department Head, Prof. Tom Smith, will collaborate on sharing details and

pedagogical design for three courses - Research Methods, Fintech and Environmental Finance. JSBF will also host Prof. Tom Smith on JGU campus for one week to teach one of these cross-registered elective courses in 2020. Details to be discussed MQ delegation visiting JGU in February 2020.

- The 2+1+1 model was discussed for undergraduate students of JSBF and JGBS.

University of New England

University of New England (UNE) is a public university in Australia with approximately 22,500 higher education students. Its original and main campus is located in the city of Armidale in northern central New South Wales. UNE was the first Australian university established outside a state capital city.

The research and teaching staff of University of New England, Australia, is divided into three faculties that together contain nine multi-disciplinary schools. JGU has discussed collaborations with the following Faculties and Schools within UNE.

- Strengthening ties between UNE Law School and JGLS with a particular focus on student mobility opportunities. We discussed ways to encourage more UNE students to participate on the India Immersion Programme at UNE and JGLS students to complete exchange semesters at UNE.
- The prospect of JGLS students enrolling in online distance education programmes to complete their mandatory Australian law subjects (required for practicing law in Australia) was also discussed. The Deans will discuss how we can take this opportunity forward for JGLS students.

- JGBS, JSBF and JSGP also discussed opportunities for student mobility and faculty collaboration.

University of New South Wales

University of New South Wales (UNSW) is one of the most reputed universities in the world and is a global top 50 university (ranked 45, QS 2019). During the visit of Vice Chancellor of JGU, Professor (Dr.) C. Raj Kumar in February 2017, an MOU was signed with the UNSW Law School to further strengthen our already strong institutional partnership.

Specific aspects of collaboration were discussed with a decision to move forward on the following:

- The establishment of a “UNSW-Jindal Global Lecture” series commencing from 2020 that could be held on a rotating basis in Sydney and New Delhi. This would involve key individuals from UNSW that would be invited to speak on pressing issues to demonstrate a strong

intellectual presence of Australia and UNSW in India. The Lecture Series may be entitled the Kirby-Bhagwati Distinguished Lecture Series.

- Prospects of UNSW hosting one JGU faculty to visit the former for teaching and research purposes for one month each year, which would initially focus on JGLS, JGBS and JSIA and, subsequently, on the remaining schools.
- Articulation and pathway programmes were discussed with the following proposals:
 - a. As regards JGLS, the possibility of exploring LLM degrees for final year law students was discussed (4+2 model).
 - b. Prospects for JGLS faculty to pursue doctoral degrees from UNSW were also deliberated. This concept has been codified in the MOU signed on 6 December 2019 between the Law Schools.
 - c. As regards JSJP, JSBF and JGBS: a possibility of a 1+1 master's degree programme was discussed. A student would pursue 2 years in JGU and the final year in the UNSW. The 2+1+1 model was also discussed for undergraduate students.
 - d. The concept of a joint conference and joint publications on Sustainable Development Goals was discussed with JSJP and

UNSW's Institute for Global Development was discussed, with the aim of convening this conference in 2020.

- e. JSBF and JGBS Deans met Prof. Li Yang, Head of School of Banking & Finance. JGU faculty will participate and present papers at the 'Australasian Finance & Banking Conference' hosted by School of Banking & Finance and Institute of Global Finance.

University of Newcastle

University of Newcastle is currently ranked 207th in the world by QS World University Rankings and it is consistently ranked within Australia's top 10 universities. The University is ranked top 8 in Australia for research 'well above world standard' by Excellence in Research Australia, 2018.

During the official visit, meetings were conducted with:

- Articulation agreements between JGBS, JSBF on the basis of a 2+1+1 model. JGU Schools to share course outlines and details of mandatory courses to initiate the course mapping process.
- Student exchange and short term mobility programmes between various Schools.

University of Sydney

University of Sydney (USyd) is consistently ranked as one of Australia's top 3-4 universities, it is a member of the prestigious Group of Eight (G8) Australian research intensive universities, and is currently ranked as a top 45 global university (ranked 42, QS 2019). It has a history of collaborations with JGU. This partnership was formalised on 27 November 2012 when the Law Schools from both institutions entered into an MoU. Several persons from the USyd have visited JGU since 2013. We have also hosted joint conferences with them.

Several breakout sessions were conducted with the faculty members of the USyd and JGU. During the meetings, specific aspects of collaboration were discussed with a decision to move forward on the following:

- A potential to initial prospects for an ‘annual lecture series’ that could be held in New Delhi. This would involve key individuals from USyd that would be invited to speak on pressing issues to demonstrate a strong intellectual presence of the latter in India.
- The possibilities to extend the CIAS’s India-Immersion programme to USyd students was discussed and an action plan on how to encourage student participation was further discussed.
- The possibilities of a semester and short-term exchange (for a period of four to six weeks) exchange programme were also discussed, across JGLS, JGBS, JSBF, JSIA and JSGP.
- The opportunities to initiate dual degree programmes between the USyd and JGU. Students pursuing the bachelor’s degree in JGU would, therefore, have an opportunity to additionally pursue a master’s degree at the USyd upon the successful completion of the former.

- A multi-disciplinary workshop/colloquium can be organised to encourage interest between faculty members from JGU and USyd.
- A status update on the JGLS/USyd agreements was discussed, and it is hoped that the articulation agreement and student exchange agreement will be finalised in early 2020.
- Prof. Baljeet Sidhu of USyd Business School expressed interest in discussing joint workshop and short term study programmes for students on business operations in India. She also expressed interest in jointly holding practitioner dialogues together with JSBF on JGU campus and USyd campus.
- A discussion will follow with Prof. Chandana Maitra about short-term internship opportunities with industry engagement, and ways to collaborate for USyd Majors in Financial Economics.

University of Technology, Sydney

University of Technology, Sydney (UTS) is a top 10 Australian and top 200 (ranked =160, QS2019) global university based in the heart of Sydney's Central Business District. While it is a relatively young university, it has been tremendously successful across faculties.

Specific aspects of collaboration were discussed with a decision to move forward on the following:

- The possibilities of a joint conference, preferably in the area of technology and the law. There are synergies between UTS's Centre for Media Transitions and JSJC, JGLS etc.
- The plausibility of a dual-degree programme at an undergraduate and post-graduate level were also discussed. In particular, 1+1 arrangements with the Masters of Public Policy and the Masters of Health Administration, as well as the MBA, with various Business Masters programmes.
- In addition, a status update on the JGLS/UTS Law articulation agreement was provided, with the hope that this agreement will be finalised in 2020. The agreement focusses on providing pathways for JGLS students to complete the subjects required to enter into legal practice in Australia.
- Discussions on bidding for New Colombo Plan projects in order to promote funding for the India Immersion Programme was discussed.

University of Wollongong

University of Wollongong (UoW), which is located in Wollongong in New South Wales, is ranked 11 in Australia and is a top 250 global university (ranked 218, QS 2019). It comprises 15 faculties and ranks among the top 2% global universities (QS ranking 2019). In addition, global employers also rate it as the top 1% for graduates. UoW is located approximately 1.5 hour's drive from Sydney. JGU has, in the past, hosted delegations from UoW and have also organized joint conferences with them.

During the Vice Chancellor's previous to Australia, JGU and UoW signed a strategic partnership/MOU through which students and faculty members from each University may spend some time at the other in short- or longer-term exchange programs. The objective behind the initiative is not only to begin a solid partnership between JGU and UoW but also to provide a strong platform for engagement between the two Universities that would qualitatively impact the learning and growth of students and faculty alike. This partnership specifically allows JGU and UoW students to undertake student exchange opportunities at the other institution. Additionally, for faculty and researchers at both Universities, it allows for joint research and joint teaching, while encouraging collaboration in international publications.

Specific aspects of collaboration were discussed with a decision to move forward on the following:

- UoW representatives were excited about the possibility of their students to enrol in JGU's well-established India-Immersion programme and it was confirmed that one of UoW's students will participate in the programme in January 2020. A tailored multi-disciplinary programme focussing on sports media, sports law, and sports business in India was also discussed as a potential way of stimulating demand across faculties.
- A multi-disciplinary colloquium was discussed as a way to stimulate academic collaborations across faculties.

Western Sydney University

Western Sydney University (WSU), formerly the University of Western Sydney, is an Australian multi-campus university in the Greater Western region of Sydney. It is a provider of undergraduate, postgraduate and higher research degrees with 10 campuses Western Sydney region. While on 30 years old as an institution, it is still ranked in the top 400 in the world (QS 2019).

During the official visit to the Parramatta campus of WSU and our additional meeting at Government House Sydney, meetings were conducted with numerous senior faculty and staff from WSU, including:

Specific aspects of collaboration were discussed with a decision to move forward on the following:

- The possibility of a joint conference/colloquium that would be hosted by both partner universities. The respective Business Schools, Law Schools and JSGP/Faculty of Humanities expressed interested in hosting such a conference to encourage collaboration between faculty members.
- Both institutions agreed to action a faculty exchange programme, with the aim that faculty members will spend one month at the host institution, teaching in their field of expertise. This will also give faculty members the opportunity to spend time to engage with faculty members from the partner institution and explore areas of research collaboration.
- For teaching and research, WSU has prioritised some areas including creative industries, cyber security, data science. JSBF will initiate follow-up discussion with Dean Mahmood in these areas.

5. Other Significant Meetings and Interactions

An official meeting with **The Honorable Justice Robert McClelland, Deputy Chief Justice, Family Court of Australia** was held at Government House, Sydney. It was agreed that JGU will enter into an agreement with the Family Court of Australia, which will allow JGLS students to intern in the Court. Details of this agreement will be discussed in early 2020.
