JGU | O.P. JINDAL GLOBAL UNIVERSITY

O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) is a non-profit global university established by the Government of Haryana and recognised by the University Grants Commission (UGC). JGU was established as a philanthropic initiative of its Founding Chancellor, Mr. Naveen Jindal in memory of his father, Mr. O.P. Jindal. JGU is one of the few universities in Asia that maintains a 1: 9 faculty-student ratio and appoints faculty members from India and different parts of the world with outstanding academic qualifications and experience. JGU is a research intensive university, which is deeply committed to its core institutional values of interdisciplinary and innovative pedagogy; pluralism and rigorous scholarship; and globalism and international engagement.

JGU has established nine schools: Jindal Global Law School (JGLS), Jindal Global Business School (JGBS); Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA); Jindal School of Government and Public Policy (JSGP); Jindal School of Liberal Arts & Humanities (JSLH); Jindal School of Journalism & Communication (JSJC); Jindal School of Art & Architecture (JSAA); Jindal School of Banking & Finance (JSBF) and Jindal School of Environment & Sustainability (JSES). JGU has been granted with "Autonomy" by the University Grants Commission and the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, for receiving the "A" Grade from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). This makes JGU the only private university in the state of Haryana and one of the only two private universities in India to be given the status of autonomy.

JGU has made history by breaking into the QS World University Rankings 2020. We are also the only Indian private university in the top 150 'young' universities in the world (under 50 years of age) in the QS Young University Rankings 2020. JGU is the youngest University in the world to feature in both these rankings. In September 2019, JGU was selected as an 'Institution of Eminence' (IOE) by the Government of India, making JGU one of only eight private universities in India to be awarded this status.

JINDAL SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS | JSIA

Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA) is India's first global policy school. JSIA offers a 2-year masters degree programme in Diplomacy, Law and Business - M.A. (DLB). The M.A. (DLB) programme has been designed as India's first inter-disciplinary social science degree that trains students for international careers and advanced learning in world affairs. JSIA has now opened admissions to the M.A. (DLB) programme for the academic year 2020-21 (classes for the 2020 batch will commence on 1 August 2020).

JSIA's main objective is to generate and spread interdisciplinary social science knowledge that informs current and future international policymaking, via rigorous academic training of qualified graduate students. This dovetails with JGU's overall institutional goal of becoming a knowledge storehouse in the social sciences, which have been long played second fiddle to the hard sciences in Indian academia.

Although the need for building a world class school as a game changer in international studies education in India has been expressed in many quarters, no university has yet walked the talk by creating one. As JGU's third School— following the Jindal Global Law School (JGLS) and the Jindal Global Business School (JGBS) – JSIA aims to act as a corrective to the sliding standards of research in international studies departments and programmes across India.

By attracting internationally qualified faculty members and pooling together minds from a number of inter-related academic disciplines under a single School, JSIA is positioning itself as a producer of knowledge and shaper of careers in international affairs.

International studies in India require a quantum leap in terms of in-depth thematic and geographic understanding of world issues. JSIA's cutting-edge research and publications agenda and collaborations with international academic and policy institutions are meant to generate continuous scholarly output on hitherto neglected issue areas that comprise the fast expanding realm of 'global policy studies'.

India's voice on global issues must be strengthened via concrete policy contributions to outstanding world problems. JSIA will be nucleus of this historic agenda.

CURRICULUM & PEDAGOGY

All students are required to take 10 mandatory courses covering the fields of international relations, international economics, international law, and research methods.

Upon completion of the mandatory courses, students may choose from a wide range of elective courses offered by the Schools of International Affairs (JSIA), Law (JGLS), Business (JGBS), Public Policy (JSGP), Liberal Arts (JSLH), Journalism & Communication (JSJC), Art & Architecture (JSAA) and Banking (JSBF) at the JGU.

In the final semester, students also have the option of completing a dissertation; the dissertation is worth 18 credits and can be done instead of elective courses of the same credit value.

Students are also required to complete a Guided Internship Programme between semesters 2 and 3. JSIA has a dedicated team of faculty and staff to assist students with obtaining internships, in both India and abroad, as per student preferences and interests.

The typical format for a class at JSIA is a discussion based seminar on the principle of student-centred teaching. Students are encouraged to engage in critical thinking and lively debate, to draw links between theory, history and current affairs and to become better aware of the relationship between power, politics, business, law and justice.

PROGRAMME MODALITIES

The M.A. (DLB) degree is offered in two modes:



Residential: It is an on-campus full-time, five days a week degree programme.



Non-Residential: It is a degree programme with classes held on weekends. Students are often working professionals from foreign diplomatic missions, defence, print and electronic news media houses, corporations and non-governmental organisations, among others.

Foreign Language training is an essential requirement for residential programme and language classes are offered throughout the duration of the programme. Students have the option of choosing from among Spanish, Italian, German, French, Mandarin, Persian/Dari and Arabic.



CAREERS FOR M.A. (DLB) STUDENTS

A Career Director assists students in finding suitable internships in the United Nations system, inter-governmental, regional and non-governmental organisations, financial institutions, think tanks and diplomatic missions. The curriculum of the M.A. (DLB) includes a mandatory Guided Internship that prepares students for careers in the multiple opportunities afforded by ever-expanding career streams like Peace and Conflict Resolution, Area Studies Experts, Political Journalism, International Justice, International Economic Development, Humanitarian Relief, Human Rights Advocacy, Political and Economic Risk Analysis etc. Graduates of JSIA go on to become versatile international affairs professionals.

M.A. (DLB) students who aim at academic careers are trained in social science theory and methods of the highest quality, so that they become eligible for admission to Ph.D. programmes at top international universities.

- JSIA provides students with the opportunity to learn from world renowned professors from prestigious international institutions.
- JSIA has a number of student exchange programmes with some of the top schools in international affairs. These include Indiana University's School of Public and Environmental Affairs (SPEA), U.S.A.; School of International Service, American University, U.S.A.; Ryerson University, Canada; Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Wroclaw, Poland; Centre for European Studies, Katholieke Universiteit (KU), Leuven, Belgium; National Tsing Hua University, Taiwan; Kyung Hee University, South Korea; and Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University, Japan.
- M.A. (DLB) students also have the option of studying at Queen Mary University of London, UK; University of Birmingham, UK, Geneva School of Diplomacy, Switzerland and University of Leeds, UK, to earn a second Masters Degree in International Affairs.

M.A. (DLB) students can also opt for summer schools at the University of Oxford, U.K.; the University of Granada, Spain; and the Fletcher School at University of Tufts, U.S.A.
